

Discography

This Discography is designed to give some representative examples of music from Jazz and non-Western musical styles. These two areas have been selected for special attention as they are probably the two least-resourced areas in most CD collections. It is assumed that teachers will be able to locate and obtain numerous examples of music from both the Western art music tradition and from the popular music tradition, as most music stores stock an excellent range of CDs in these areas. Jazz and non-Western music is readily available in stores also, however, the lists below provide a starting point for teachers who may wish to order CDs over the phone or the internet.
